

Mohawk Valley Junior Golf Tour Power Rankings

After Event #6: Woodgate Pines

Minimum of 2 events to be in power rankings

Boys 16-18

1. Cody Homer (No change)
Took the day off Monday and didn't compete at Woodgate Pines. Homer is expected to be back in action Friday at Skenandoa.
2. Nick de Jong (Up from #3)
Played well enough for second place in the small field at Woodgate with an 81. Throw out his one bad day at Oneida and he has a stroke average as low as Homer's, and his three starts following up that day at Oneida have resulted in a second, third, and second. After Monday, he leads the points list by 9 points.
3. Bradee Holtslag (Down from #2)
Didn't compete at Woodgate Pines, and won't be back in action until Rome CC.
4. Eamon Dempsey (No change)
Dempsey also did not play at Woodgate, but should be playing at Skenandoa on Friday.
5. Dan Reese (Previously unranked)
Reese picked up a win in his first event at Stonebridge last week, and followed that up with a fifth place finish at Woodgate, only 3 shots out of first.

Boys 13-15

1. Seth Adams (No change)
Adams shot his lowest round of the year on the par-70 at Woodgate, a 74, which lowered his season average down to 76. It was his third straight event without a win, but he is playing the most consistent golf on Tour right now, claiming his second runner-up of the year in addition to two wins.
2. Aaron Macchia (No change)
Tied Adams at Woodgate, also shooting 74 and picking up his first runner-up of the year. Macchia is on a positive trend right now, as his last three events have gotten him 21 of his 33 points this season.
3. Mike Kalil (No change)
Kalil did not compete at Woodgate but hangs on to the number 3 spot, though he won't be competing again until Seven Oaks.

4. Joel Jakubowicz (No change)

Takes home a victory at Woodgate Pines, his first of the year, with a 73. He only retains his spot this week instead of moving up because I couldn't punish Kalil for not competing, and numbers 1 and 2 also did nothing to deserve falling back.

5. Alex Malta (No change)

Didn't compete at Woodgate but holds on to number 5 this week, though he is also not expected to play at Skenandoa.

Boys 12+Under

1. Tommy Mandel (No change)

Mandel took the day off from Woodgate, but has now officially clinched the points title no matter what happens the rest of the season. Should be back in action at Skenandoa.

2. Reiss Brand (No change)

Brand did as he should this week, taking home a tie for first place in Mandel's absence by shooting 41. This was his first victory of the year.

3. Cameron Soja (Previously unranked)

Soja has quietly become one of the best players in the division this year. His stroke average is fifth best, he ranks fourth on the points list, and he has placed in-the-points in five consecutive events.

4. Ben Kallet (Previously unranked)

Kallet has been slightly inconsistent this year, with two events where he did not come close to points, but also four top-4 finishes, including a win.

5. Matt Dreimiller (No change)

Dreimiller holds on to this spot because of his consistency. He did not compete at Woodgate, but has four consecutive in-the-points finishes.

Girls 16-18

1. Kelley Citrin (No change)
Took home another victory at Woodgate. She shot a 92, bringing her overall average to 91.5, and is the only player to have shot under 100 this season.
2. Katie Daskiewich (No change)
Second place at Woodgate to Citrin with a 105. Her average this year is 105.75, nearly 10 shots better than Raynard.

Girls 13-15

1. MaryAnn Bulawa (No change)
Almost shot a round of even par this week (which is all her dad really wants from her), but finished with a 2-over par 36. This was still good enough to win by 10 shots.
2. Rachel Halwig (No change)
Halwig gets her fourth second-place finish of the season at Woodgate. She is the only player besides Bulawa who has broken 50 every time this year, and has an average of 46.25.
3. Nicolette Darois (No change)
Came in fourth place at Woodgate Pines, but shot a very respectable round of 47. She is still second place on the points list, 12 points behind Bulawa and 10 ahead of Halwig.

Girls 12+Under

1. Sydney Bard (No change)
Didn't play at Woodgate, but is expected to play this Friday at Skenandoa.
2. Lilly Bulawa (No change)
Takes the victory this week at Woodgate (by beating her sister) with a very good round of 48. She takes the points lead from Bard in her absence.
